



What grade level is this meant for?

I designed this for my 9th-12th-grade Leadership class. Since these activities cover straightforward, non-age-specific things like traits of a leader and brainstorming schoolwide project ideas, you should have no problem using this with middle schoolers.

Will this work for my <insert unique setting here> kids?

I've been thrilled over the years to hear how people have used these activities (like summer camps, clubs, conferences). Most of the activities have been designed to work in any group setting, not just a leadership class.

If your student council meets only semi-regularly, you absolutely can do these activities. You just may need to pick and choose which ones you have time to complete.

Is this editable?

Yes! All student materials come in both print PDF and editable Google versions, so you can customize them to meet your student's needs, but due to the nature of these being teambuilding and collaborative activities, they really should be completed on paper, not on computers.

I don't have 4 weeks, can I pick and choose the activities we do?

Totally! There are a few core things you should do at the start of any group: team building, discussing the meaning of leadership, assessing current issues, goal setting, and reflecting on personal assets. For each of these, there are multiple activities included. Mix and match whichever combo works for your group and time constraints!
