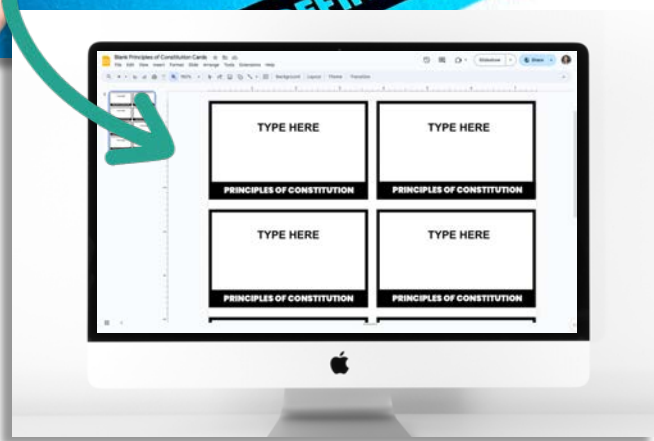
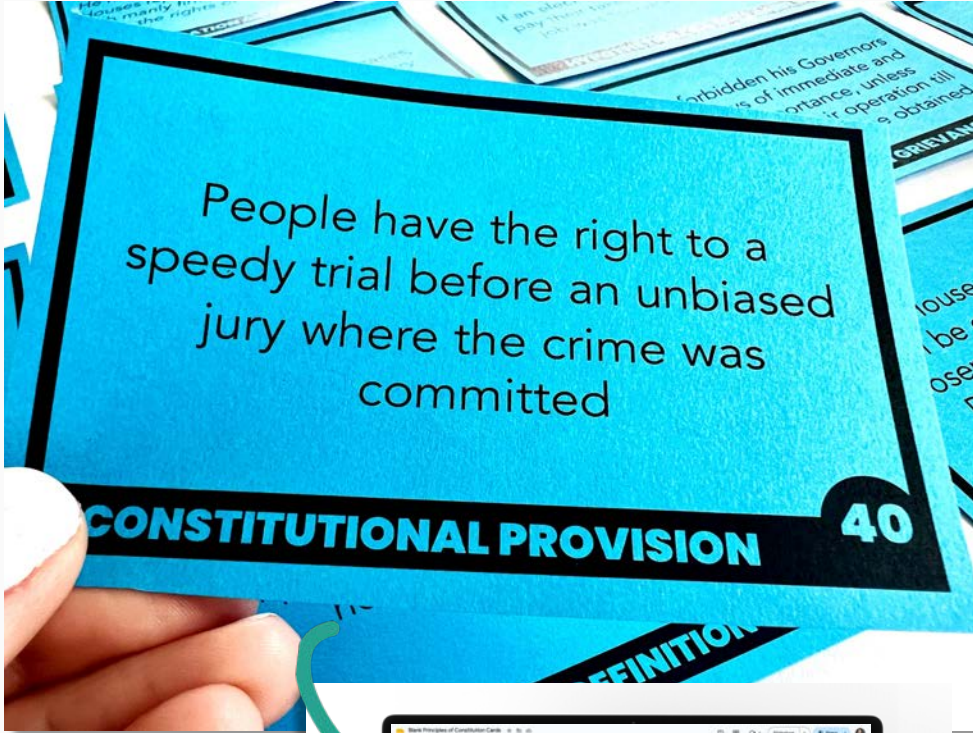


With Declaration of Independence References
